
Rabbit & Poultry Fun Show, Antigo

The **Meat Animal Quality Assurance** Youth Certification program is required for all swine project members and is recommended for both beef and sheep project members (*it counts as an educational meeting*). <u>All members who will be</u> <u>exhibiting swine at the Amherst or Rosholt</u> <u>Fairs must get a Pork Quality Assurance</u> <u>Certificate every year</u>. This is done through the MAQA training class.

- Youth 8-11 must attend the training each year.
- Youth 12-14 (intermediate) and 15-18 (advanced) can certify/recertify by <u>annually</u> attending MAQA <u>**OR**</u> their age. For example, if they are 12 and pass the exam, they do not need to recertify until they are 15.
- •To certify by test, a minimum of 70% of questions must be answered correctly. If you do not pass the exam, you will be required to stay and attend the class.



Speaking Contest: Friday, May 6 @ 6:00 p.m. Horse Bowl/Hippology: Saturday, May 7 @ 8:30 a.m. *UW-Marathon County, Wausau*

<u>Hippology Contest</u>: Teams of selected individuals from each county (not a pre-entered team) in Beginner, Junior, and Senior divisions compete by using a score sheet to rapidly answer questions at several stations. **<u>Horse Bowl</u>**: Teams of 3-4 members in Beginner, Junior, and Senior divisions compete in a competitive demonstration of knowledge. DID YOU KNOW...?

The Carson Climbers are the oldest 4-H club in Portage County, founded in 1932. Portage County, Wisconsin is the top producer of snap beans in the United States of America.

One of the largest Portage County 4-H clubs in the 1960s was the Grant 4-H Club based in Kellner, WI. The Grant 4-H Club dissolved in 1999. Today, the largest club by enrollment is the Rosholt Pioneers 4-H Club.

In the 1930s, the Rosholt Fair Association paid about \$1,000 in premiums each year...about \$17,000 in today's dollars!

The first recorded "Point" pun when referring to Stevens Point comes from the *Illustrated Historical Atlas of Wisconsin*, published in 1878. The author writes of Stevens Point that "there were no building[s] at this 'point' prior to the fall of 1843." There have been eight 4-H Youth Development Agents since the position was created in 1951. Connie Creighton has served as your 4-H agent since 1994.

The first Portage County fair was held in 1869 in Amherst. According to a 19th-century history of the county, "the exhibitions [were] highly credible and well attended." One of the first 4-H projects in Portage County was Alfalfa. 300 school children were given alfalfa seeds in 1924. Though families were skeptical it could be grown in the area, about 25,000 acres of alfalfa hay are now planted in Portage County.
