New Volunteer/Mandatory Charter Training

In order to renew its charter, each club must send at least one youth or adult leader to a designated training each year. **This year, the new volunteer training will fulfill that requirement.** If clubs have new leaders who need to attend they can attend as the representative for their club. If you would like to become a 4-H leader, you are required to attend a two-hour orientation/ training, sign a list of volunteer behavior guidelines, complete a background check through the state's background check system, and complete an online mandatory reporter training. The orientation will help you learn more about 4-H and your role as a volunteer, to strengthen your understanding of how to work with youth, and to encourage safe practices.

Note: The mandatory reporter training must be completed before you attend the New Volunteer Training. You can find training materials under the "trainings" tab of your 4H Online account.

Another new leader training will also be held in January!

2019 State Dog Show Results

August 9-11 the state dog 4-H show was in Janesville, at the Rock County Fairgrounds. There were 4-H members from 32 counties competing in the various categories, totaling about 200 kids. Portage County had four 4-H members attend the state 4-H Dog show. The Portage County dog project did the best in competition that it ever has.

Clare Kluck (Howling Huskies): With Australian Shepherd, Rhea, they earned 1st place In Pre-Novice obedience. They also earned Highest Scoring Pre-Novice dog/handler. In Intermediate rally, they placed 1st in their class and also earned highest scoring Intermediate rally dog/handler team. This was Clare's first time competing at the state 4-H dog show.

Samantha Carlson (Nelsonville Zippy Zees): With Australian Cattle Dog, Captain, they earned a 6th place out of all grades in Pre-Open obedience. In Masters Rally, Sam and Captain earned 2nd out of all grades. With Australian Shepherd, Riggs, they earned a 5th place in Graduate Novice obedience. In Masters Rally, Sam and Riggs earned 4th place out of all grades. In grade 10 showmanship, Sam and Riggs earned an 8th place.

Ayla Miller (Almond Busy Bees): With Miniature Poodle, Millie, she earned a first place in Pre-Novice obedience and a third place in Intermediate rally obedience. With Doberman, Nova, they took 2nd place in her showman-ship class.

Cassie Lehman (Almond Busy Bees): Competed with Australian Shepherd, Hazel, and earned participating awards in Pre-Novice obedience and Intermediate rally obedience classes.

August 17th was the State 4-H Agility show at Canine Sports Zone in Middleton, WI. Ayla Miller, with Miniature Poodle named Millie, and Cassie Lehman, with Australian Shepherd named Hazel. They competed in two classes: 1) Tunnelers 2)Jumps, Tables, and Tunnels. Ayla earned a 2nd place in Tunnelers and a 1st place in Jumps, Tables and Tunnels 8-inch height class! Cassie qualified in both her classes, competing in the largest classes at state.

CITIZENSHIP WASHINGTON FOCUS - WASHINGTON D.C.

Date: June 13-21 or July 4-12, 2020 Ages: Gr 10-12 (at least 15 years old during trip; at least 2 years in 4-H & at least 1 year in Youth Leadership project)

Total Trip Cost: ~\$1400 Registration 4-H On-Line: November 15 — December 15 Special Note: First Come, First Assigned Preferred Week!

Approximately 200 Wisconsin 4-H Youth are selected to attend this leadership program held at the National 4-H Center. Participants learn the importance of civic and social responsibilities as they relate to the development of better citizens and leaders. The week consists of participatory workshops, speakers, committee work, field trips and social events.

NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE- WASHINGTON D.C.

Date: March 28-April 2, 2020 Ages: Gr 10-12 during program (min. age 15 and max age 18 as of January 1) Total Trip Cost: ~\$1300

Registration : Applications are Due to State 4-H Office by December 15, 2019 Special Note: Final Selection Occurs at State 4-H Office

Each county in the state can nominate two candidates <u>to be considered</u> for the National 4-H Conference. In the fall of 2019, candidates will receive the state application to fill out for travel in 2020 if selected as one of the 6 state delegates. The state will review all of the applications an select only 6 delegates to represent the state of Wisconsin. Each participant selects an issue (i.e., education, promotion, environment, violence) and works with other youth from across the county to develop plans to help direct future 4-H programming. Delegates spend the majority of time contributing to stimulating, task-oriented groups. One day is spent on Capitol Hill meeting with legislators and touring.

WISCONSIN 4-H AND YOUTH CONFERENCE - MADISON

Date: June 22-25, 2020 Ages: Gr 7-10 at time of selection **Total Trip Cost**:: ~\$300 *Registration 4-H On-Line: April 2-15 Special Note: First Come, First Assigned Preferred Seminars* Approx. 600 youth attend this event in Madison each summer. Participants take part in educational seminars and assemblies and meet people from across Wisconsin. They are encouraged to take what they learn and share it with others in their community.

NATIONAL 4-H CONGRESS - ATLANTA, GEORGIA

Ages: Gr 10-12 (max age of 18 as of January 1; at least 3 years in 4-H) Total Trip Cost: ~\$1200 Registration 4-H On-Line: May 1—June 1

Delegates participate in self-development seminars, tours, and a service project, while exchanging ideas with youth from across the country. Seminars range from ethics topics, career planning and organization to diversity, character and success. Hands-on experiences such as community service and cultural activities.

They will be recognized in October at the end of their career at the 4-H Leaders Banquet. **Maximum Number**. 
