COVID-19 Update

With the recent changes affecting the governor's "safer at home" order, there have been questions about how this affects 4-H. As a program of UW-Madison's Division of Extension, 4-H is following UW guidance, informed by the Badger Bounce Back public health plan.

- All overnight camps are canceled for the remainder of the summer.
- For June: still holding virtual events with rare exceptions of limited in-person gatherings of up to 10. These meetings and programs will require the Educator/Volunteer to demonstrate both the need and a thorough plan for maintaining safety guidelines.
- Out-of-state 4-H program travel is also not permitted through the summer.
- For July: Virtual and no-contact events continue. More exceptions granted for small gatherings, with a formal approval process. Online training on Extension's guidelines will be offered to staff and related resources available to volunteers and participant
- Beyond: We will continue to monitor the outbreak of the virus. Keep in mind, the rates of COVID-19 infection have not decreased. How the virus tracks will inform our decisions and process. Extension will also work closely with state and UW-Madison Campus leadership and follow the guidelines for those institutions. We will continue to monitor the outbreak of the virus. ROSHOLT FAIR ENTRIES

The Rosholt Fair will be using the same online system as last year: **FairEntry**.

Entries are open from June 8th to July 15th!

- 4-H exhibitors will sign up for exhibits using their 4-H Online Account information. Exhibitors will be able to indicate whether they want to show an entry through their 4-H club or FFA chapter.
- Cloverbuds do not add entries; they can just bring their exhibit to the fair. You do not need to add them to your family's account.
