






addition, hygiene items, candies, trinkets, books, word finds, puzzles, blankets and more were bought to help lift their spirits!



OLD BUSINESS: COVID-19 Update – A recent change in policy defines a family pod as a group of people who share the same household. A family pod counts as 1 when determining 4-H group size. Up to 10 family pods will be allowed to meet outdoors or in a large building such as a barn. No food is allowed at the gathering and social distancing must be adhered to. Preapproval is required. | Rosholt Fair Update – Per Rosholt Fair Board there will be a fair this year. Fair packets have been distributed. The 4-H office is working on judging binders. No word on when wristbands will be available. Volunteers are needed to work in exhibit building and help with clean-up. Everyone working in the building needs to wear a mask. | Camp in a Bag – Bags have been delivered. Contents includes owl pellets, tie dying, bubbles and making rockets. 12 families signed up for a total participation of 20. Total included 3 non-4-H members and 5 camp counselors. Four virtual camp meetings were held. | Other - none

NEW BUSINESS: Re-Enrollment in 4-H Online – Cut off date for access to the 2019-2020 information in 4-H online will be August 21st. Program will be transitioned from version 1.0 to version 2.0. New version should be available on September 1st. Version 2.0 should be easier to use and more mobile friendly. It can be used by clubs to take minutes and record attendance. Information from prior year is supposed to roll over with the exception of for the custom reports. | 2020 -2021 Club Charters – Paperwork will be mailed to clubs. A video link that explains the charter paperwork will be emailed. Financial report is due September 1st. This year copies of the club's check register or ledger are also required to be submitted as part of the financial report. There is an online form that can be used. Electronic signatures are acceptable. Remainder of charter documents are due November 1st. | Other: Masks - Lynette reported that the Plover Clovers are making free 4-H masks. Just fill out a request form. | 4-H Program Status - Due to COVID-19, the following programs have been cancelled: Speaking and Demonstration contests, 4-H Awards program and 4-H Leader's banquet. | Record Books – We can still have awards. We need to consider ways to evaluate candidates electronically. Michelle recommended that the general leaders determine which youth in their club should receive the leadership awards. Youth would be required to submit completed youth leadership forms and general leader would need to complete a nomination form for each candidate. Jan pointed out that project records should also be required for the project leadership awards and that the Youth Leadership record needs to be revised. New Ideas – Debra discussed a 100-day positive deeds chart with stars and being a pen pal. | Agent Report – Currently working from home. Yearly charter meeting will be held via Zoom. Fall Forum will be online this year. We could do leader recognition online. Teen leaders are struggling due to COVID. Ideas for program modifications: Clubs might consider rolling over officers instead of holding elections. Almond Busy Bees is taking garden produce to the Senior Center. 
