So wear that 4-H shirt, plaster the clover all over social media, and share your love of 4-H with your friends, teachers, family, and neighbors!



4-H AMBASSADOR



The Ambassador term will start in March. Ambassadors will serve an active term of one year but will also be an associate member of Ambassadors for the duration of their 4-H membership.

Requirements: Must be in 6th grade or higher; must exhibit leadership ability and potential; must exhibit personal appearance and poise; must exhibit knowledge of 4-H.

When: 4-H Ambassadors serve a one-year term beginning in March. They will be recognized in October at the end of their career at the 4-H Leaders Banquet.

Maximum Number: Up to 4 Ambassadors are chosen.

Duties: Present the 4-H story at community activities and events and promote 4-H.

Responsibilities: Hand out ribbons and trophies at the Amherst and Rosholt Fairs; participate in the Amherst and Rosholt Fair parades; make presentations to groups (we will train you); presentation of flags and pledges at the 4-H Leaders' Banquet and Award program; help with the 4-H Awards Program; be available to represent 4-H at other events during the year.

WISCONSIN KEY AWARD



Requirements: Must be in at least 10th grade of the current year, have at least 3 years' experience in 4-H and 1 year of enrollment in the Youth Leadership project.

Maximum Number: Up to 3 recipients. This is the highest state 4-H award offered. It is based on all 4-H work done by the member since joining 4-H, including youth leadership.

2022 PORTAGE COUNTY REGISTERED HOLSTEIN CALF PROJECT

The Portage County Holstein Association is again offering to help young people get a start in the Registered Holstein business.

The number of awards and dollar amount will be at the discretion of Holstein Association Board. The grant(s) will be used to purchase a Registered Holstein calf for 4-H, FFA or WJDA projects.

Here are the conditions:

- 1. Member of Portage County 4-H Club, FFA or WJDA Chapter.
- 2. Between the ages of 9-16 as of January 1, present year.
- 3. Portage County Holstein Board member's families are eligible.
- 4. Selection will be made by a committee named by the Holstein Association Board.
- 5. Holstein Association members will be available to assist with the selection of a project calf.
- 6. Project calf must be registered in winner's name.
- 7. Project calf must be cared for, shown at Amherst and Rosholt Fairs <u>or</u> Marshfield Fair and be available for inspection at any reasonable time.
- 8. Completed application should be returned to: Connie Creighton, 1462 Strongs Avenue, Stevens Point, WI 54481. **Applications must be postmarked or dropped off at the Extension Office no later than October 31, 2022.**
- 9. All applicants will be recognized, and the winner will be announced at the Holstein Association's Annual Banquet in November.
- 10. The winner must become a State Junior Holstein member.
- 11. This award can only be received one time, although a non-recipient is eligible to reapply as long as they meet the award requirements.

The application will be judged on the applicant's need for help in getting started with Registered Holsteins, neatness and completeness of the application, ability to provide a good home for a calf and the desire of applicant as expressed in the essay.

Preparing for the New 4-H Year



The 4-H year officially begins in October each year. Even though the program year begins in October, 4-H enrollment begins in September. Counties in Wisconsin usually have an enrollment "deadline." This deadline can be the cutoff for determining who can represent 4-H at certain events.

No matter the date of your local deadline, re-enrolling in 4-H through the 4-H Online portal as soon as possible ensures that you receive all 4-H communications and other important program news.

Adding, Dropping, or Keeping Projects

Enrollment is the perfect time to add or remove projects in your 4-H Online profiles. 4-H members usually continue with the same projects from the year before, and it's pretty normal to add one or two new ones as well! First year members are recommended to only select one or two projects for their first year. The second year of membership is a great time to pick between three to five total projects.

Work with your youth to see what projects they liked, didn't like, or want to learn more about. There is nothing wrong if your member decides to keep the same projects from the year before!



Reminder: 4-H members in grades K-2 can only be signed up for the Cloverbud project!

Member Goals

On the opposite page, 4-H members are being challenged to write their personal 4-H goals for the new year. Setting goals can help with project selection, and it should help members plan out a path to success in the new 4-H year. See what goals your youth has chosen for the new 4-H year and identify ways to help them achieve those goals.

Family Member Goals

Have those in your family set goals as well! Goals might include attending more club meetings, helping at 4-H activities, or participating in certain county events. Try to find ways to keep 4-H as a togtherness activity!

Club Goals

Each year, 4-H clubs complete a Charter Renewal form. This form is usually completed by adult leaders and youth officers, but the charter might be talked about at a club meeting. Clubs are tasked with identifying club goals each year. Have your family brainstorm some S.M.A.R.T. goals for the club to strive for in the new year, such as planning an outreach event with a local community group or adding more welcoming activities for new families.

Specific: Goals should be well defined and clear.

Measurable: This will help you know when you've been successful.

Achievable: Be realistic! Think of things that will challenge you but are still doable.

Relevant: Your goals should be important to you. Set goals that you want to complete!

Timely: Give yourself a specific time frame to complete your goals.

The deadline to register for the Conservation Speech Contest is Friday, December 16th at 4:00 p.m. Speeches will be performed and judged at the Land and Water Conservation Committee meeting on Tuesday, January 3, at 5:00 p.m. Speaking Contest divisions are: Elementary - grades 5-6 (3-5 minute speech), Junior - grades 7-8 (4-6 minute speech), and Senior – grades 9-12 (5-7 minute speech). Speeches must promote the conservation of natural resources and the protection or enhancement of environmental quality.

Awards are given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in each division for each contest. First place finishers in each contest advance to the Area contest, then the State contest. First place posters at the State contest advance to the National contest. Awards vary at each contest.
