Do you like to give speeches, read a book aloud, demonstrate a skill or tell a story? Then join us for the 4-H Speaking & Demonstration Contests!

Please note: depending on the number of entries the Demonstration Contest may be moved to Tuesday, March 26th at 6:00pm. Participants will be notified after registration closes if that is the case.

Contest Rules

- Members may submit up to 2 entries in any speaking category. Please make topics appropriate for all ages.
- Groups (2-6) are allowed for any category, but compete as individuals. The grade of the oldest person in the group will decide in what division the group competes.
- Judging will use the Danish system. Awards are ribbons, and Rosholt Fair premiums. A Best of Show will be selected for each age division. Cloverbuds receive participation ribbon.
- Demonstrations may be done individually or by a team of two youth.

Original Speech

A speech written by the speaker on any topic, possibly pertaining to 4-H, such as his/her projects or activities. An introduction and closing are required and included in the time limit. Speaker may use notes. Use of a podium is optional.

Prose Reading

An interpretive reading of a short story or a cutting from a novel, play or essay. A series of prose readings or cuttings from readings on the same subject or theme may also be used. Original material is acceptable. An introduction is required and included in the time limit. Reader must read prose from the printed page and stands during presentation. Use of a podium is optional.

Poetry Reading

Poetry Reading - An interpretive reading of a poem or a cutting from a poem. A series of poems or cuttings from poems on the same subject or theme may also be used. Original material is acceptable. An introduction is required and included in the time limit. Reader must read the poetry from the printed page and stands during presentation. Use of a podium is optional.

Storytelling

A telling of a story, such as a folk tale or fairy tale, without memorizing exact words. Original material is acceptable. An introduction is required and included in the time limit. Notes are not allowed. Storyteller sits during presentation.

4-H Pledge Recitation

Individual for Cloverbuds Only (K-2nd Grade) - Participants will recite the 4-H Pledge with actions. No Time Limit

Play Acting

An acting out of a play or a cutting from a play performed by an individual or group (2-6). Original material is acceptable. An introduction is required and included in the time limit. Must be memorized. Actors may sit or stand. No costumes, sound effects, or props (other than chairs). Emphasis is on character development through voice, movement, facial expressions, and gestures.

Speaking Contest Entries Are Judged On the Following:

- Did the presentation grasp interest from the start?
- Were important points stressed with emphasis/gestures/facial expressions?
- Did it fit the time limit?
- Did the speaker show enthusiasm for the topic?
- Did the speaker make eye contact with the audience?

- All characters in your scene should be made using Peeps. Dioramas can use any type of Peep.
- Limit one entry per person.
- Limit one entry per family.
- Each entry needs to be titled and related to a 4-H project.

New and Returning Volunteer Trainings

Attention adult volunteers: If your 4-H enrollment has not been approved then you are still in need of completing a required training(s) or background check. If you aren't sure what you need, please reach out! Until you are fully trained, you are not considered a volunteer nor covered under 4-H insurance. Below is an overview of all required 4-H volunteer trainings.

Grow Green (Replaces VIP Training)

Wisconsin 4-H has updated their VIP Leader Training to Grow Green! This is an online course that you can take when it best fits your schedule. If you have completed VIP you are still considered trained and don't need to take Grow Green.

Building Safe Spaces Training

This training includes information about the difference between appropriate and inappropriate touch, prohibited behaviors (including sexual misconduct), best practices when working with youth, and reporting procedures.

Supporting You, Supporting Youth (Title IX Reporting)

All Wisconsin 4-H volunteers are required to report incidents of sexual misconduct that take place in Extension programs and complete training on how to report concerns. The questions and answers contain more information about this requirement.

Mandated Reporter

All Wisconsin 4-H volunteers are required to immediately report any incident of child abuse or neglect to law enforcement or human services. This training provides information on when and how to report.

Supporting Youth Mental Health

Adults who volunteer with young people, care about young people. One way to show we care is to give help and support when someone is feeling down. That's what the Supporting Youth Mental Health for Volunteers Training—Supporting YMH, for short—is all about. Knowing how to support youth when they're down, whether it's simply a bad day or it's more than that.

Background Check

All volunteers are required to have an initial background check and then a recheck every 4 years thereafter. The State 4-H Office uses a company called HireRight to complete their background checks online. Volunteers will receive an email from HireRight with instructions to complete their background check.

OFFICER REPORTS: Treasurer's Report and Approval of Bills: Checking \$29,651.96 Savings \$ 617.67 (\$117.67 quarterly interest) Treasurer's report was placed on file. | Secretary's Report and Correspondence: None

OLD BUSINESS: Club Charters & Financial Reports -All club charters have been completed except River Valley Riders. Charters are due November 1st. Lisa will submit same goals for Leader Association that were submitted last year. | Re-Enrollment in 4-H Online- September 1st through November 15th. Families need to log in to their 4-H Online accounts. |Fall Forum – Two youth attending: Juniper Ryberg and Marie Keck. The Leaders Association will pay the entire registration fee for them to attend.

NEW BUSINESS: Nomination & Election of Board Members – Tabled until the November meeting. |Nomination & Selection of Volunteer of the Year - Malayna Polum was selected for 4-H Volunteer of the Year. Sharon will prepare the write-up. |Nomination & Selection of Friend of 4-H - Feltz's Dairy Store was selected for the Friend of 4-H Award. Jan will provide Lisa with information about Plat Book and Cookbook sales and discounted gift certificates for the gingerbread contest. |Nomination & Selection of 4-H Alumni – Jordin Rekowski was selected for the 4-H Alumni Award. Dr Barb will prepare the write-up. | 2023 Awards Program and Leader's Banquet - November 11th and 12th - Price of meal for banquet will be \$16.50. Jan recommended that we decrease the amount of money spent on table decoration to \$30.00 and keep the meal price for adults at \$10.00 each. Agnes Mallek's club will be providing the table decorations. Motion by Jan and second by Betty to charge adults \$10.00, children \$5.00 and to provide free meals for first year leaders and award winners. Motion passed. Leaders will provide the desserts. Ambassadors will be helping with the banquet so their meals will also be free. Karen is looking for volunteers to help clean-up after the banquet. Need teens who attended trips to provide presentations at the Leaders Banquet and the Awards program. Lisa will contact them. Juniper will be the MC for the awards program and the ambassadors will help with presenting awards and prizes. |Record Books & Record Book Committee - Bonnie and Betty met prior to tonight's meeting to select award recipients. Lisa has all the awards ordered from the 4-H Mall. She also ordered \$150 worth of items from Oriental Trading to be used for award program prizes and virtual contests. Two camp certificates with a value of \$40 each, will be given away as door prizes. |Funding for State and National 4-H Events - Information about applications for State and National 4-H Events has been posted on the State 4-H website. American Spirit Trip applications opened October 15th and Space Camp applications will open November 15th. Portage County youth interested in applying for State and National 4-H Events need to know if they will be receiving funding from the Leaders Association. Jan is willing to design an application form for youth to use to apply for the county 4-H funding that was included in the Leaders Association budget. She recommends that the form includes a parent/guardian signature and the signature of the youth's General Leader confirming active club membership of the applicant. Amount of funding per youth will be based on number of applicants. Per the information included in the letter sent to 4-H clubs about working in the 4-H Food Stand, youth who work in the 4-H Food Stand may also be eligible for financial assistance from the Teen Leaders Association. | County-Wide workshops/project meetings - A virtual pumpkin contest is being offered in October and the virtual gingerbread contest will be held in December. A recording of the Record Book workshop is also available. | December Meeting Cancelled | Other – A joint multi-county 4-H Camp at CWES will be held this summer. | Five teens attended the Teen Leader's movie night.

Agent Report– Connie has started physical therapy. Her injury is high on her shoulder so she is not able to drive yet. One of her sisters will stay with her in September and another sister will stay with her in October. Connie's next doctor appointment is November 1st. That is the earliest date that she could be cleared to return to work.

OLD BUSINESS: Club Charters & Financial Reports – Per Connie, all are in. Thank you. |Re-Enrollment in 4-H Online- All 4-H leaders and members need to re-enroll. If re-enrollment is not completed by November 15th, 4-H correspondence will no longer be sent. | Fall Forum – Two Portage County youth, Juniper Rydberg and Jennifer Keck. attended the 4-H Fall Forum. Juniper led a watercraft interactive station on Saturday morning. Per her mom, Jennifer enjoyed the event and would like to attend again. Jennifer missed out on applying to be on the Wisconsin 4-H Leadership Council this year and will be too old to serve a two-year term next year. Jan shared that she served a one-year term on the Council when an adult Council member was not able to complete their second year. Connie will check to see if this is a possibility. |Pumpkin Contest Update – Had great participation. Awards have been posted. Next event will be the Gingerbread Contest. | 2023 Awards Program and Leader's Banquet – Great turn-out for the event. Committee received lots of help from Lisa. Suggestions: Keep program length less than 2 hours, do a better job of pronouncing award winner names, shorten time for prize drawings by continuing to draw next name while previous recipient is picking up their prize. Statement made that having two 4-H events to attend on the same weekend is difficult. Can the awards program and leader awards (no meal) be done on the same day? Connie prefers to keep them separate. She wants the youth to do as much as possible in the planning and presentations at the 4-H Awards Program. Comment was shared that the Amherst Community Spirit is willing to publish club reports for all the Portage County 4-H clubs. |AmeriCorps – 4-H Leaders Association received \$3,500 in grant money from the Community Foundation of Central Wisconsin to employ a 4-H AmeriCorps Volunteer in 2024. Money will be kept in a separate ledger. 4-H AmeriCorps volunteers work 900 hours (20 hours/week) from January to August and are paid \$2,500 by the University of Wisconsin. The Leaders Association will be billed by the University. Other program expenses could include mileage, computer and phone access and cost of supplies used to work with youth. The goal of this position is to expand the number of youths involved in the 4-H program in Portage County by initiating activities such as library programs, after school programs and partnerships with other youth groups such as the Boys and Girls Club. Only one person applied for the Portage County 4-H AmeriCorps Volunteer position. Connie will be setting up a zoom interview for either Tuesday, November 28th or Thursday, November 30th. Jan volunteered to represent the Leaders Association at the interview.

Amount of funding per youth is dependent on the number of applications received. In the future we may want to set up a maximum amount of funding provided, such as up to 40% of cost of event. Then this maximum could be included on next year's application. |Awards & Ambassador Interviews - Will be interviewing for Key Award, Leader of Tomorrow Award and 4-H Ambassadors on Wednesday, January 17th. Jan Miller and Karen Jastromski volunteered to help during interviews. | County-Wide workshops/project meetings - Louise is planning another ceramics workshop on Sunday afternoon, December 3rd at the Boston School Forest. The bisque ceramics that were donated last spring, and the brushes and paints will be provided or youth can bring their own. Enrolling 30 participants in the last workshop proved to be too large a group. Participation at the upcoming workshop will be limited to 12-15 participants. Staining and dry brushing will be the focus of the next workshop. Future workshops will cover antiquing and other techniques. Louise is also willing to do ceramics workshops at club meetings. Plover Clovers expressed an interest. Connie's sister Sandy could do a virtual session about rock polishing. She could also do a follow-up workshop about rock tumblers. Sharon is considering another barn quilt workshop and would enlist the help of youth with previous experience making barn quilts.
