4-H - Positive Youth Development

Amy Boelk, 4-H Program Educator

- A summer 4-H camp at Upham Woods for youth in grades 3-7, where campers explored nature, developed leadership skills, and formed lasting friendships through hands-on outdoor activities. Through this program, youth-built resilience, teamwork skills, and a sense of belonging in a safe, supportive environment. Total Reach: 70 youth
- A Rosette Making Workshop for the local Home and Community Economics group of ladies in the Stevens Point area to teach them how to make intricate ribbon rosettes so that they could spend the morning creating Rosettes to benefit our 4-H Youth at the upcoming Speaking and Demo contest and other future events.
- Management, recruitment, leadership and oversight of a 4-H
 AmeriCorps Member to work in Portage County in an effort to increase 4-H programs offered to youth throughout the Summer.
- Planning for transition of the Portage County Market Animal Project (a current 4-H chartered group) to develop a 501c3 for their animal auction at the annual fair in order to better

streamline the work their group is doing for youth livestock education versus animal auction and facility/capital improvements on the fairground. The goal is to transition the auction and financial elements of their group to a 501c3 non-profit, so that the remaining 4-H livestock group can focus on more robust educational outcomes for all youth in the county, not just those auctioning animals at the Rosholt Fair. Total Reach: 15 adult volunteers, 50+ youth in livestock-related projects







Agriculture

Additional Agriculture work being conducted in Portage County

- Extension Mini Clinics are being planned for Cranberry Summer Field Day, to showcase current UW
 research on weed management screening trials, protoventuria leaf spot and virus testing, and
 physiology research trials. -Allison Jonjak, Cranberry Outreach Specialist
- A Virtual Brown Bag was hosted, providing cranberry growers with real time field updates on pollinator behavior, insect sweeping result trends, and heat stress management. - Allison Jonjak, Cranberry Outreach Specialist & Amaya Atucha, Fruit Crop Production Specialist
- An updated suite of nutrient management publications is being prepared to enable cranberry farmers
 to reference the most up-to-date information regarding nitrogen, phosphorous, potassium, and
 micronutrient needs and efficiency for cranberry production. The current publication suite is from

Community, Natural Resources & Economic Development

- Planning for a regional rural housing summit hosted in Stevens Point in collaboration with state and regional CDI educators, and local, regional, and state housing partners. The goal is to engage developers, local government, and housing practitioners around rural housing solutions and best practices in order to increase affordable workforce housing and local economies in their area.
- Serving as a member of the founding board for the Portage County Community Land Trust start-up, where the goal is to establish a community land trust that ensures long-term housing affordability and stability in Portage County. Total Reach: 5 board members, 4 work-group members.
- Partnering on a Wisconsin Partnership Program Community Impact Grant with CAP Services, Inc.
 and the UW Center for Community and Non-Profit Studies to grow and improve CAP Services'
 housing repairs programming. A goal of this project is to improve the accessibility and timeliness of
 their services in order to improve housing conditions for low to moderate income individuals and
 improve health equity in housing.
- Extension is serving on the local project team for the Portage County Safe Streets and Roads for All
 Action Plan creation, whereas this effort seeks to engage community members through
 demonstration and education activities as well as through public input during the planning process.



The goal of this plan is to eliminate roadway fatalities and serious injuries through the development of a comprehensive safety action plan.

Additional Community, Natural Resources & Economic Development work being conducted in Portage County

- An in-person hike and class for women woodland owners and women interested in stewarding woodlands, where participants hiked through woodlands to learn about seasonal phenology and techniques to draw and observe natural happenings in woodlands. Through learning phenology and nature journaling participants can identify woodland patterns or problems that may arise, they can also create a new connection with their land helping them and their families stay involved in management. This volunteer training was offered to the public at Schmeeckle Reserve (UWSP) so that citizens could learn to support bumble bees in their garden, identify bees, and how to submit photos of bees to the WDNR Bumble Bee Brigade. A series of four summer school lessons on natural resources for outdoor adventure summer school participants in 3rd and 4th grade, where they learned about a variety of natural resources topics so that they can better understand and appreciate the outdoor world. A study to better understand nitrate occurrence in the streams of the central sands and link that occurrence to land use. FoodWIse

- Shared leadership in the Giving Gardens committee of Partners HP, where emphasis is placed on promoting and supporting efforts to maintain community gardens, improve food security, and provide educational programming in Portage County.
- A series of StrongBodies strength training sessions in partnership with Berkshire At The Grove, where older adults also receive nutrition and health education. Participants engage in regular strength training exercises to improve muscle strength, balance, and flexibility so they can stay healthy and socially connected.

Additional Health & Well-Being work being conducted in Portage County

- Covering Wisconsin creates education, outreach, and promotions messaging and tools for the public that are disseminated through myriad formats and venues around Wisconsin (e.g. toolkits for community partners, social media campaigns, bus placards and billboards, streaming digital ads, resource events and fairs, trainings for professionals, and health insurance literacy "How To" sheets). Through this programming, we help people in Wisconsin obtain, effectively understand and utilize health insurance, reducing the number of uninsured and underinsured people in our state. - I conducted a virtual workshop on 'using data to inform grant-writing' virtually. This workshop focuses on locating public health data and evidence-based approaches to support grant-writing. This workshop results in increased capacity of community partners to utilize evidence-based practice and practice-based evidence in program development and implementation, and increased community capacity to identify and address health inequities through the development and strengthening of processes and resources. - Navigator enrollment assistance provided to anyone in Wisconsin, where 97,013 consumers were assisted with health insurance questions or enrollment. Through this effort, our Navigators completed 4,041 qualified health plan enrollments through the federal Health Insurance Marketplace and assisted 5,615 consumers with Medicaid, resulting in widespread access to health care and improved health outcomes.
