
Come Trick or Treating with the 4-H Teen Leaders Association! Teens will be collecting canned goods and nonperishable food items for Operation Bootstrap.



2025 Funding Assistance for State and National 4-H Events

4-H members can discover their "spark" through opportunities at the club, county, state, and national levels—including educational events sponsored by Wisconsin 4-H. Six youth have already signed up. |4-H Ambassador Activities – Per Sharon, 4-H Ambassadors did not attend Mark Motors Safety Fair this year. Amy has a list from the Amherst Fair Board about areas ambassadors could help with. She will set up a meeting with Sharon to discuss. Christine requested that ambassadors help MC the Clothing Revue at the Rosholt Fair. |Amherst Fair – Per Amy, Juniper will be judging Cloverbud entries. 4-H will have a 3-day presence at the Amherst Fair which will include activities, a goose chase scavenger hunt and a 4-H photo booth. |June Dairy Days – Juniper manned a 4-H booth. Christine and daughter helped make grilled cheese sandwiches. Other activities included distributing ice cream and face painting. 75% of volunteers were 4-H members. This year's event was scaled down from previous years. Activities were moved from an indoor building to the outside. No tours were offered this year.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Scholarship Presentation – The 4-H Scholarship presentation will occur on July 14th at 6:30 p.m. at the Amherst Fairgrounds, prior to the Leader Association meeting. |4-H Food Stand – Malayna was not present at this board meeting. Per Amy, the work schedule has been determined. Food stand needs exhaust fan. Louise explained that the Teen Leader food stand planning meeting had been postponed due to the rescheduling of the candle making activity which was part of the meeting agenda.

NEW BUSINESS: Leader Board/Association Reorganization - Board vs. Association - Leader Association Bylaws need to be revised. Last revision occurred in 2012. Language needs to be updated to be in compliance with current State 4-H policies. Need to clarify what Board votes on and what has to come to Association for a vote. A sample of current State 4-H Leader Association Bylaws will be sent out to all the 4-H Leaders. |County-wide leader info meetings - Looking for ways to encourage club leaders to participate in the Leader Association meetings. Need to provide leaders with an opportunity to share ideas and resources by incorporating a social element to the meetings. Per Amy, a robust club leader training will be held in the fall to cover all the 4-H program changes that will take place in the new enrollment year. |Budget Recommendations: Changes for 2025-2026 fiscal year - Jan met with Amy last week to prepare a draft copy of the Leader Association 2025-2026 projected budget. Due to State 4-H program changes, several budget items have been removed from the Leader Association budget. Beginning July 1, 2025, insurance and literature expenses will be paid for by the county 4-H office. Leader Association will no longer receive the club dues. Club dues will be paid directly to the county 4-H office. The significant changes to the projected budget draft are as follows: Ignite 4-H Event has been changed from an event where delegates are chosen to an event open to all youth. The Citizenship Washington Focus Event has been combined with the Ignite 4-H event as an optional additional day for participants who are interested in participating. Jan is recommending that the requirement for youth to submit applications for Leader Association event funding be eliminated.

Since the cost and number of event participants/year varies, the funding would be more uniform if the Leader Association funds 35% of the event cost for all 4-H State and National events. Amount of funding can be provided to potential applicants when they receive event registration information. Number of youth participants listed beside events is based on past history and is just an estimate used to determine possible cost. Budgeted event scholarship funds are interchangeable. Subtotal for all events is \$3,950.00. This number represents the total amount of event funding available for any combination of events. Motion by Marilyn, second by Louise to recommend Leader Association approval of the 2025-2026 Leader Association Projected Budget. Motion passed.

Dues to Portage County 4-H Office, Per Amy, dues can be paid to the 4-H office individually by members or by the club. Funds will be used to offset cost of literature, insurance and county wide 4-H programming. Amount charged for dues will be based on State 4-H recommendation and will not exceed \$5.00.

Speaking & Demonstration Contests – A Speaking and Demonstration Contest will be held at the Amherst Fair on Friday, July 18th from 4:00-6:00 p.m., right before the cake auction. Event registration uses Google sign-up. Lisa will enter participants in FairEntry.

Clothing Review – Contest will be held on Monday, September 1st from 2:00-4:00 p.m. at the Rosholt Fairgrounds. A workshop will be held on August 6th from 6:00-8:00 p.m. An onstage practice will be held on August 28th (night exhibits are brought to the fair).

Plat Book – Photo entries for Plat Book Cover Contest are due July 15th. Who selects photos to be included in photo collage? Jan will check with Lisa.

4-H EDUCATOR UPDATE - Presented two 4-H scholarships at Amherst High School. Juniper's position is funded by AmeriCorps again. She will be working with the Boys and Girls club and library programs. 25 attended Tie Dye Event at Central Sands School and 18 attended Stepping Stone Event at the Lettie Jensen Library in Amherst. Attendees commented that they appreciate events scheduled at other county locations besides Stevens Point. Camp counselor training has been completed. Summer Camp will be next week from Monday through Wednesday. Rosholt Fair still in transition. Fair Board appointed Lisa Wroblewski to be 4-H liaison between the 4-H office and the Fair Board. County wide Kick Off Open House event will be held to explain all the new changes to the 4-H program related to the re-enrollment process. Sign up period for volunteer leaders has been changed.
