AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

KEY AWARD

Requirements: Must be in at least 10th grade of the current year, have at least 3 years' experience in 4-H and 1 year of enrollment in the Youth Leadership project. Maximum Number: Up to 2 recipients. This is the highest state 4-H award offered. It is based on all 4-H work done by the member since joining 4-H, including youth leadership.

LEADERS OF TOMORROW AWARD

Requirements: Must in at least 11th grade, and exhibit leadership ability and potential. Maximum Number: Up to 2 recipients. Recognizes character, balanced personal development, and excellence in leadership.
